

WEST MICHIGAN FORUM

Circular Economy

We support and elevate efforts of local businesses and institutions working to create a circular economy in their communities and industries.

The Forum is West Michigan's leading advocate for recycling and solid waste diversion. We promote a circular economy mindset and the understanding that waste has economic value, providing support to businesses and organizations through our partnership program and educational engagements.

We are the only resource in the area for multicultural and bilingual recycling education, including engagement efforts that are helping to inform recycling contamination interventions and market development initiatives locally and statewide.

In 2020 we worked with partners to launch a project to eliminate single-use plastics in local Hispanic businesses, and to create a set of fact sheets on food donation liability.

Climate Leadership

Our Vision: Through business leadership, Michigan can eliminate net greenhouse gas emissions and contribute to a future where GHGs in the atmosphere are declining.

In a year already beset with climate impacts locally and abroad, the pandemic brought a renewed sense of urgency for climate action, highlighting how challenging it could be for businesses and communities to equitably reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Through our members and partners, we are advocating for climate leadership goals and promoting resources for refrigerant management, clean energy and other solutions to reduce emissions and sequester carbon.

In 2020 we partnered with the Environmental Defense Fund and the RE-AMP network to advocate for climate leadership in the public sector. We partnered with municipalities in Berrien County to plan Earth Day activities as an introduction to sustainability, introduced PACE financing to new regions, and led a new collaborative effort among Michigan colleges and universities (Earth Day 50.5).


Equity and Sustainability

Sustainable business should center social and environmental justice, providing a mechanism for businesses and institutions to dismantle and support alternatives to white supremacy.

Sustainable business has a responsibility to work alongside under-resourced populations and communities of color to address historical disparate impacts affecting members of these communities due to public policy or market-based actions. We are highlighting the potential role of the business community as advocates for business practices and civic priorities that advance social and environmental justice. We are engaging businesses in an active process to identify and eliminate racism, while working to decrease barriers to participation in sustainability for diverse groups.

With initial support from the Wege Foundation, the Equity Program has become a signature initiative of the modern WMSBF, a model for white-led organizations in the state's sustainability movement. BEYOND SUBSIDY PLANNING PROJECT

Convened a group of local advocates, service providers and stakeholders to help chart a new course for emergency utility action focused on asset-based solutions and sustainability. A partnership with Kent County Essential Needs Task Force.



LA CAMPAÑA VERDE AND LATINX PARTNERS

Launched sustainability initiative in partnership with West Michigan Hispanic Chamber of Commerce and 15 Latino businesses led by El Granjero Mexican Grill. Also hosted five events for Latinx community in 2020, three in Spanish.



CONVERSATIONS OF COLOR

On behalf of Sierra Club, engaged business leaders and community organizations on environmental justice and the Green New Deal, also creating an intentional space for people of color that would become the Greater Grand Rapids NAACP Environmental Justice Community Coalition.



SUSTAINABILITY AND COVID

Hosted 15 webinars that introduced thousands to the disproportionate impacts of pandemic and resilience needs. Documented outcomes from access and education provided to diverse business and community leaders.



Community Resilience

Regional and statewide networks that facilitate collective leadership on resiliency and equity through a mutually beneficial flow of information, expertise, and resources.


The Forum uses a boundary organization model that co-creates with other networks and initiatives, providing a value chain that enhances sustainability, resilience and civic engagement. Our projects advance institutional trust and collaboration, providing a common language for diverse stakeholders and competing interests.

As one example, we are the region's leading advocate for the inclusion of climate science in business and municipal decision making. Our Adaptation Framework provides a climate adaptation toolkit that can be used for general resiliency needs.

In 2020 we hosted a series of live and online forums highlighting Michigan's current climate crises, programs on high water and public health that proved prescient. We promote green stormwater infrastructure, helping to improve relationships between local businesses and their subwatersheds.

In 2021 we will pilot a new resilience hub program with support from the U.S. Sustainability Directors Network.




